My goals are: to have this case carefully reviewed, an innocent man sits in prison while a killer is loose on the streets of Dallas county.

Possibly the lives of the other witnesses are in danger. I didn't go public in the hopes that law enforcement, arrest the real killer.

Beyond a reasonable doubt...what does this mean? There is some doubt about reasonable doubt in criminal cases, but the burden of proof remains on the prosecution. The government has the burden of proving the defendant guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

Did Amber Moore seek justice or just a conviction? Was this prosecution based on guilt or on avoiding the hefty price Dallas County would have to pay if it acquitted an innocent man?

February 6th, 2023 State prosecutor Amber Moore's theory of the case:

1. Tamezcano was at the Lamplighter Motel on the day of the murder.
2. Tamezcano murdered Antonio Duran.
3. Tamezcano murdered Duran with a deadly weapon, a handgun.
4. Tamezcano did commit the act of shooting Duran two times in the head.
5. Tamezcano fled on foot from the scene of the crime.
6. Tamezcano then used the bus to flee into Oakcliff and was later arrested and held under arrest for murder and spent three years waiting to be put on trial.

Amber Moore spent three years postponing the trial in order to find anything that connected Tamezcano to the murder scene. Amber Moore had only **one** witness, a man with a violent criminal record. Steve Gamez, was previously sentenced to twenty years in

prison for assault with a deadly weapon.
States exhibit 212 Criminal records.

After Amber Moore rested her case, I can say that the elements of the charge of murder were not proven. The evidence must show beyond a reasonable doubt that Jose Luis Tamezcano was the man responsible for Antonio Duran's murder. The standard of evidence to support a conviction must show without a reasonable doubt a clear connection between the accused, the crime, and the victims of the crime.

Jaime Lopez the 911 caller is missing.

- - Elizabeth Rodriguez has passed away. Note: Steve Gamez was insistent during the witness examination in saying that he had not seen Elizabeth at all.
- - Steve Gamez also asserted that he did not know where the other witnesses lived or worked. Steve was not asked if he knew this information. He volunteered this information.
- -When Steve confirmed that he spoke to Maria Cerda, and Maria Domingues, he told the prosecutor twice that the other witnesses were very afraid to see Steve Gamez.

The other witnesses refused to come to trial. Steve Gamez testified under oath " I saw a man die, I could not forget any details of that night"

Amber Moore's evidence of Tamescao's guilt:

1. **Fingerprints on a single beer belonging to Jose Luis Tamecano. Out of 7 or 8 cases of beer.**
2. **Tamezcano's palm print on the front passenger side of the door of a Trailblazer parked in front of room 117.**

Amber Moore spent most of the four-day trial reviewing photographs of the body and the motel room. Amber had a long list of police officers and detectives who had been a part of this investigation. Amber had the 911 operator brought in as a witness. Not the actual caller. The fingerprint identification specialist was also a witness.

Rule 403. Excluding Relevant Evidence for Prejudice, Confusion, Waste of Time, or Other Reasons

The court may exclude relevant evidence if its probative value is substantially outweighed by a danger of one or more of the following: unfair prejudice, confusing the issues, misleading the jury, undue delay, wasting time, or needlessly presenting cumulative evidence.

Amber decided to show the jury photos of the deceased at the crime scene. Close-up photos of the medical examiner's autopsy analysis. Including but not limited to photos of the bullet entry holes in the skull, facial bruising, and close-up photos of the deceased's hands, face, head front and rear, and chest. Also, Mr. Duran lay face down on the floor in a pool of blood in the motel room. The prosecutor even showed the dead body in the body bag.

No probative value came from the showing of such graphic images. Nothing in those photos was debated. Furthermore, they did not answer the question of who killed Mr. Duran. Amber calculated that the jury would only be confused and prejudiced against the defendant.

Amber also exposed more of the inconsistencies of the case. For example,

The medical examiner made a mistake in his report and realized it at trial when Amber Moore showed crime scene photographs and had him explain some details.

The medical examiner was brought in as a witness. While testifying he was asked why the palms of Duran's hands were purple. He explained that blood pools in the lowest parts of the body. Amber then showed the medical examiner photos of the crime scene.

The medical examiner then realized the man had died sitting down and was later moved into the lying-down position he was found in. The palms of Duran's hands were purple. However, the face, chest, and stomach were not. Suggesting that Duran was shot and left in a sitting position with his palms facing down. In that position, his palms would have been purple due to blood pooling there.

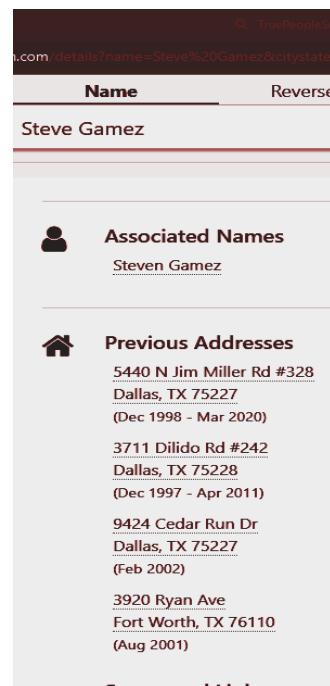
From the evidence photos shown to the medical examiner, it was evident that Duran was left in that position and later moved or repositioned. The medical examiner had not seen the evidence

photos and did not know what position he was found in.

Thus when police arrived at 7:26 p.m., no pool of blood had formed. Photos of the pool of blood at the time of the murder show the pool of blood to be too small. Amber missed this expression of realization on the face of the medical examiner.

During the trial, only one witness testified about the murder.

The witness' name is Steve Gamez. Steve was convicted of assault with a deadly weapon and sentenced to 20 years in prison. Steve has a history of arrests for possession of narcotics and DWI.



Note: From my own research of public records, I was able to find that he lived until 2011 on Dilido Rd adjacent to the motel. It is likely that he fled to his own storage unit when he ran to the storage facility.

February 7th, 2023 Steve Gamez raised his right hand and swore to the truth of his

testimony. As for the events of August 24th, 2019,

Prosecutor - How did you end up at the Lamplighter Motel?

Gamez- Elizabeth texted me and invited me to come and hang out. We drank beer till 3 or 4 am. That's when we ran out. We bar-hopped a bit and then had to wait until Saturday at 12 noon to purchase more beer.

Prosecutor - did you know everyone there?

Gamez- It was the first time I met Maria. Antonio Duran called Lacrisha to come over and she did.

Prosecutor - What happened after that?

Gamez- Antonio drove my black Dodge Charger to my apartment so I could shower. I had a few beers and I don't drink and drive.

Prosecutor- Did you know Jose Antonio Duran?

Gamez- yes, he was a good guy, he was chill, we would BS, I knew him for a while, homeboy we would hang out and shoot the breeze.

Prosecutor - when did you return to the motel?

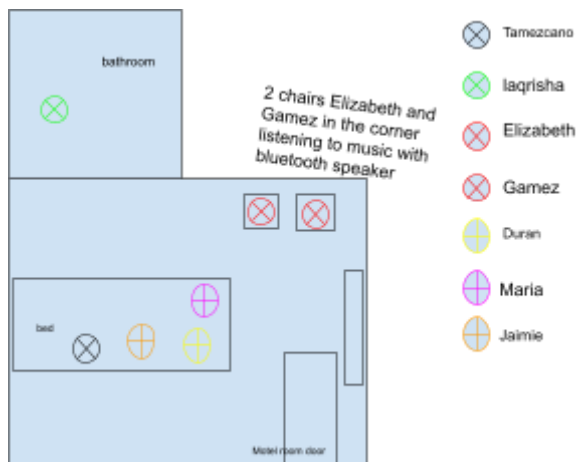
Gamez- I drove on the way back. Antonio had been there for two hours. It was now 4 or 5 am.

Gamez- I hung out all night on Sunday because of Elizabeth.

Prosecutor - What occurred next?

Gamez- after bar hopping I'm not sure who drove my Dodge Charger back to the Lamplighter Motel. We got back and Elizabeth, Maria, Lacrisha, and I listened to music. I was getting to know Maria. Elizabeth knew Maria and Lacrisha.

Prosecutor - do you see the defendant in this courtroom?



Gamez- yes, he's wearing a black and gray sweater with a rumpus pattern.

Gamez - At 12 noon on Sunday, Antonio, Jamie, and Tamez headed to the liquor store.

Gamez - Lacrisha was told to call the men, and they confirmed they were on the way back.

Prosecutor - What are the defendant and Antonio doing at this point?

Gamez- nothing talking with Maria.

Prosecutor - Was anyone fighting?

Gamez - Everything seemed normal.

Prosecutor - where was everyone in the motel room at this point?

Prosecutor had a large white paper next to Gamez and she had him tell her how to draw the room layout line by line and also place the people in the room.

Note: Gamez never told the prosecutor where the restroom door was located. He also did not say who the "Lacrisha" woman was that he kept mentioning. Court subpoenas don't list this name.

Prosecutor did not mention that the chairs were in the wrong location and did not ask about it.



For comparison, a diagram was drawn in reference to what I saw in the pictures taken by the crime scene analyst. You will notice that Gamez and Elizabeth are somehow mirrored in the version Gamez had the prosecutor draw.

This could be indicative of a lie about his original point of view. It would seem he was in a different part of the room initially facing the opposite way.

This effect of the mirror image description in his testimony may show that the original point of view and his now testimony are in contradiction with each other.

Prosecutor- Where was the defendant relative to Duran?

Gamez- He was sitting on the bed talking to Jaime. Duran was next to Maria at the foot of the bed.

Prosecutor- Do you remember the room number?

Gamez- no, I can't recall.

Prosecutor - What was the defendant doing before he shot Duran?

Gamez - He was nervous and seemed anxious. He was pacing back and forth in the room. I asked him if he was OK?

Prosecutor- Describe the events in the order they happened.

Gamez - I thought a firecracker was set off. I saw Duran fall backward. I thought Tamez had thrown a firecracker at him.

Gamez- That is when I saw a gun come up, I hurried to the restroom with the girls. I locked the door and got low to the floor and put my shoulder on the door to keep it closed.

Prosecutor - who was in the bathroom with you?

Gamez - Lacrisha, Elizabeth and I.

Prosecutor- how many gunshots did you hear? ,

Gamez- I could not hear anything with the restroom door locked. About two minutes passed with no sound.

Gamez- I opened the door for Elizabeth who was left outside the room. She pounded on the door, begging to be let in. I opened the door.

Note: Somehow Elizabeth is inside the restroom and is banging on the door outside the restroom. Gamez then said that for two minutes it was silent. But at the same time, all the women were hysterical and Elizabeth was banging on the bathroom door.

Note: No mention of Maria or Jaime.

Prosecutor - just to be clear what did you see happen to Mr. Duran?

Gamez - I see Duran fallback. The gun came up and I was in survival mode. Duran was on the floor. We came out of the restroom. Ran out to the parking lot.

Prosecutor- to be clear, at this point Tamez shot Mr. Duran?

Gamez- I heard a gunshot and saw a gun come up. I stood up. Lacrishia and Maria were hysterical. I was in shock but did not have time to be in shock. Tamezcano was in his own world. Zoned out. Strange behavior. He had a mean look.

Prosecutor - was he on drugs? Were there drugs in that room?

Gamez - Everyone in that room was on meth.

Prosecutor - have you seen the defendant look like that before?

Gamez - I had seen him elsewhere before. Different places. He was playing with a knife one of those times. Very strange. He had scratches on his face and arms.

Prosecutor - what did you do next?

Gamez- Tamez was standing over Duran. I saw my chance and ran outside with Elizabeth, Maria, and Lacrishia. We got into Maria's white van.

Exhibit 13 shows all cars. No white van.

Prosecutor- Who "is" we?

Gamez - Jamie, Lacrishia Elizabeth, Maria. Tamez tried to leave in my Dodge Charger, but It was locked. Tamez then got in the van, he had the gun so we got out, and I was now sitting behind the van's taillight.

Prosecutor - Did you see the gun in his hand?

Gamez- No, I don't know if he had a gun. He kept screaming" let's go, let's go let's go."

Note: Gamez said there was a white van belonging to Maria. None of the exhibits showed a white van.



Exhibits did show A Chevrolet Trailblazer belonging to Duran. And a Ford Impala. Gamez stated that he drove there in his

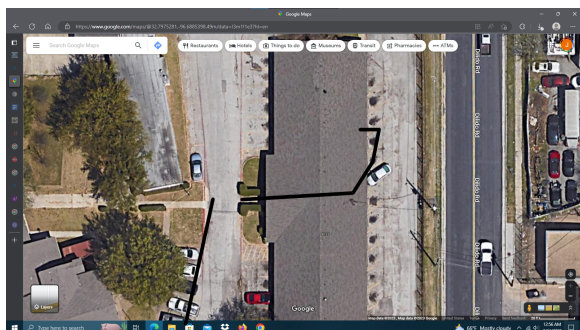
black Charger. No exhibits showed a black Charger.

- Gamez - I run for the sidewalk. Tames has a gun, I am in fear, so I can either face the

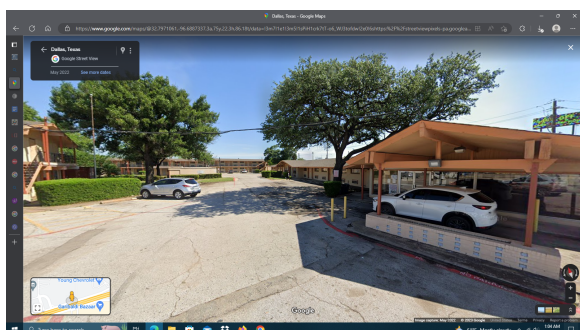
gun or run away. Maria, Lacrishia, and Elizabeth stayed there. I took off and ran through the parking lot towards the office. I waited two minutes.



Then I took off through the parking lot past the main office.



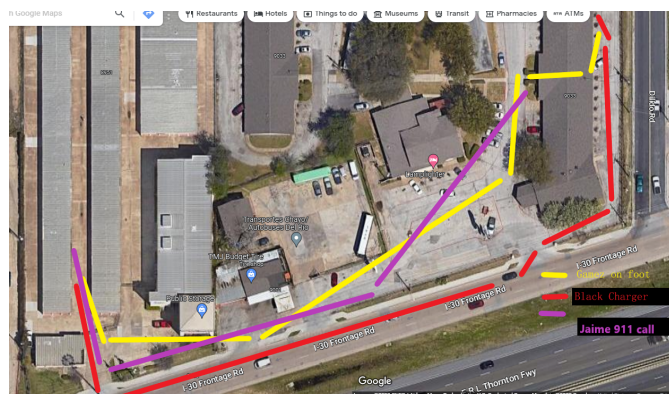
Passed the highway and jumped a fence into storage.



I called the girls "Come get me" I waited for the girls, then went back. 20 or 30 minutes. Cops show up and then we go back.

Note: Gamez said he took off running toward the office and waited 2 minutes. On foot. Then takes off past the highway and jumps a fence into a storage facility to wait for the girls.

Which would later be confirmed by the recorded 911 call that Jaime Lopez made.



Prosecutor- Did you review anything to refresh your memory of the event?

Gamez- yes I saw my police interview yesterday. I didn't forget anything. I watched someone die.

The prosecutor passes the witness.

Note: Gamez states he was able to watch his police interview to refresh his memories.

Cross-examination by ex-Judge Cunningham- to whom I will reference as Judge.

Judge. When they returned from the store, how long after that did the shooting occur?

Gamez - Within an hour.

Note: Duran went to buy beer at 12 noon. We don't have a return time but we now know that within an hour upon return to motel Duran was dead.

Judge- what was Tamezcano doing right before?

Gamez- Pacing back and forth talking to Jamie.

Judge- do you know why he shot Antonio?

Gamez- no, I have no idea.

Judge - was everyone using drugs?

Gamez- I'll be honest, I did a few bumps of cocaine, and meth was used throughout the night.

Judge- Did you feel your memories were impaired by that?

Gamez - No, not at all.

Judge - Which way did the body of Antonio fall?

Gamez - I didn't see it. Don't recall.

Judge - How many gunshots did you hear?

Gamez - One, I don't know. I could not hear from inside the bathroom.

Note: Gamez refuses to testify directly that he knows:

1. **How many gunshots.**
2. **The Direction that Duran's body fell.**
3. **That he saw a gun.**
4. **That he saw a gun in Tamezcano's hands.**

Judge - Mr. Gamez you were convicted of an armed assault and given the maximum sentence of 20 years but you only served 10 years, is that correct?

Gamez: Yes.

Judge- you tried to make it seem like you don't drink and drive, yet you had a DWI arrest, while in possession of an illegal substance, cocaine not even 3 months ago which is a state jail felony.

Gamez- that's taken care of.

Note: I don't know of anyone who can just take care of a state jail felony in 3 months without jail time and make it go away. Was this deal offered in exchange for his testimony?

Judge - The night in question, Tamez shot Duran without a reason.

Gamez - I don't know.

Judge- Do the girls work at the Tigers cabaret?

Gamez - I don't know.

Judge - you testified that everyone was taking methamphetamine and beer. Does it surprise you to learn Duran had a 0.48 BAC in his toxicology report which is a DWI?

Gamez- DWI is .8 that's double the limit.

Judge- correct, did you witness Mr. Duran do drugs?

Gamez - I did not see Tony get high.

Judge - his toxicology report said he had Benzodiazepine in his system. Benzo pills. Do you know what those are?

Gamez - no. Elizabeth brought drugs. Not sure where they came from.

Judge- is it your testimony here today that Tamez shot Duran without motive, which made you and two other girls hide in the restroom, you all waited two minutes then you came out and you spotted Tamez standing over Duran, after which you ran out of the motel room?

Gamez - yes

Judge - Did you see the gun in the hand of Tamez?

Gamez - I didn't see the gun.

Note: Games simply ran out of the room, and didn't try to save a supposed friend. He didn't ever go back to give first aid. Gamez goes on to say he saw a man die. He makes no mention of concern for his friend, he makes no mention of any observation as to details of his death, and claims he saw him die. Is it possible that he was the shooter? That's why he said he watched him die.

Judge- or is it more probable that you shot Tony then you ran and you hid the gun? For 20 minutes You spoke with the girls and got your story straight at the storage facility, then went on to provide a witness statement to law enforcement.

Gamez - no

Judge - Did they swab your hands for gunpowder at the police station?

Gamez - No.

Judge- Did they check for blood splatter?

Gamez - No.

Judge-You ran to the storage, waited 2 minutes then jumped the fence, then called the girls to go get you. Why didn't you call the cops?

Gamez- Tamez was loose and had a gun.

Judge- Why hide for 20 minutes? Was it to get your story straight?

Note: when Gamez calls the girls to pick him up. do they drive his charger to the storage? Are they possible accomplices? Or have their lives been threatened by Gamez? Is that why all the stories match up during interrogation? Why did none of the witnesses show up? Were they threatened? Are their lives in danger?

Gamez- I was in fear.

Pass the witness.

Prosecutor - Have you seen or spoken to the other witnesses?

Gamez - I have not seen Elizabeth at all. Maria Lacrishia and I talked about...

Judge - Objection to hearsay.

Prosecutor - Do not mention the conversations.

Gamez - yes, I understand.

Prosecutor - Have you communicated with the other witnesses?

Gamez - yes I ran into them a couple of times. They were scared to even look at me.

Gamez - Tamez really scared them.

Prosecutor - How many times have you seen them?

Gamez- I ran into them a couple of times, but I don't know where they live or stay.

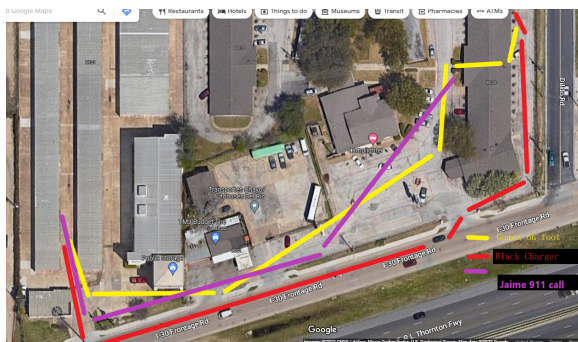
Note: The question did not ask if he knew where they lived. The question was how many times have you seen them?

Gamez - At different spots where we hang out.

Prosecutor - When did you see them?

Gamez- A couple of months ago, they looked scared.

Prosecutor- Who was Antonio to you? Tony was a friend. I don't have a reason to shoot him.



The 911 emergency call recording.

operator: how can we assist you?

Male caller: there's been a murder at lamplighter motel.

The room is under my name, I had a room.

Male caller: Blue killed him,,

Male caller: Heading towards Tigers cabaret on foot.

operator: Where are you?

Male caller: I'm at the motel, I'm right here.

Male caller: Headed towards Buckner, he said he knows everyone, and he's going to kill me.

Operator: What's your name sir?

Male caller: Jamie Lopez.

Operator: What's the suspect's name?

Jamie: Robert, He took the gun with him, and I'm going to try and hide.

Note: there is nowhere to hide, no trees or bushes. See the picture below.



Operator: What is the suspect wearing?

Jamie: Black shirt with big purple letters, blue jeans, and some Nikes. .

Operator: Where is he now?

Jamie: He's walking to Buckner, I'm hiding now.

Note: officer's testimony was that a male was waving him down in the middle of the road.

Operator: What is the suspect's name?

Jaime: Robert, blue they call him Blue.

Operator: officers are on the way.. They are about to get there.

Jamie: I see your officers, I'm going to wave at them.

Note: how could he hide and also see the officers coming down the 1-30 service road?

Witness questions.

Prosecutor: Who made the call?

Hernandez: A Jamie Lopez male.

Prosecutor: What clothes description did he give you?

Hernandez: Black shirt with big purple letters, blue jeans, and some Nike shoes

Cross-examination.

Judge: What name did the caller give you for the suspect?

Hernandez: Robert AKA Blue.

Judge: does that sound like Jose Luis Tamezcano AKA El Guerro?

Hernandez: No.

Judge: Does this match the description given to you? These are the defendant's arrest clothes."

Shows the state's exhibit of Tamezcanos arrest clothes Blue button-up shirt, long sleeve, Blue jeans, black and white basketball shoes, white socks."

Hernandez: no it does not match.

Judge: The defendant's name is Jose Luis Tamezcano, aka el Guerro. Does that sound similar to Robert AKA Blue?

Hernandez: No it does not.

Prosecutor: how did the suspect leave the area?

Hernandez: on foot, going to Buckner. Then he also said Going to Tiggers.

Note: the real killer spoke and threatened Jaime. The prosecutor could not produce him as a witness. Currently, no one knows his whereabouts.

Trial Day 2, 2/7/2023

State witness Dallas Police Officer Valdez

Report: Call came in at 19:24 minutes 7:24 pm Arrival time 7:26 Pm

Report narrative: First on the scene of the murder.

Room 117 door was open, and a man lay on the floor near the open door. No pool of blood had formed. Two shell casings.

Partner checked for a pulse. The officer cleared the room with help of partner officer Perry. Could smell gunpowder in the room.

En route to the scene of the murder, the officer did not see a suspect matching the description along the I-30 service road.

The officer did see a Latin male, who seemed panicked, and nervous. Name Jaime Lopez, told the officer to hurry to the room. The officer proceeded to tape off the parking lot and held the perimeter of the scene of the crime.

The officer later arrested all the witnesses that came back about 30 minutes later.

Three women, one male. Put them in separate police cars to be taken to headquarters for questioning.

Note:

1. The officer arrives on the scene two minutes after the 911 call.

2. Taped off the crime scene. The black Dodge Charger is already gone.

3. No suspect on foot was seen by the officer on the I-30 service road.

4. The witnesses, three females, and one male returned about half an hour later.

State witness Dallas police officer Perry

Confirms open door.

The male is face down on the floor.
No other people were in the motel room.
Two shell casings.
Officer Perry did a pulse check. No pulse.
Shot in the head, the officer stood at the door after the room was cleared.
Began taking witness statements after they returned 30 minutes later.
Was at the motel room within 2 minutes of the call for service. 7:26 pm.

Note: officer perry confirms witnesses returned at the same time. About 30 minutes later.

**State witness Mathew Adamson
Crime scene analyst.**

Exhibit 10, and 13 show the cars in front of the room, a Chevy Trailblazer and a Ford Impala.

Exhibit 29 shows Room 117.

Exhibit 201 diagram of parking lot Impala Trailblazer no black charger.

50 or so beer bottles 7 or 8 cartons

Note: out of 50 only 1 beer can had Tamezcano's prints out of 7 or 8 cartons worth of beers.

**State witness Dallas officer Rojo.
arresting officer.**

Arrest at 10:12 pm Tamezcano calm.

Breathing heavily, cooperating, and answering questions.

Noted: Yes sir no Sir answers.

Stated he was asking for help, and someone followed him and he requested police officers be called.

Had a cell phone and was not aggressive or evasive.

Very respectful.

Taken to Parkland Hospital.

Detective Heathcote is the lead detective on the case.

His notes for August 24th, 2019.

The suspect fled on foot.

Named Robert AKA Blue.

No surveillance video was found.

Three shell casings were found in the room.

No firearm has been found.

Wrote a warrant based on witness stories.

Shown states exhibit 226, 227, 228 Dallas map Lamplighter motel and Tamezcano arrest location. In Oak Cliff. Exhibit 228 bus route.

Detective cross-examination highlights.

1. Did the detective do a GSR test on all witnesses? No, only Tamezcano and his clothes. Tamezcano tested negative.
2. Was the detective aware that Gamez fled the scene and was gone for 30 minutes? Yes,
3. Gamez stated he drove his charger to the motel. Was there a Black Charger at the motel? No.
4. Was Gamez checked for GSR or blood splatter? No
5. Was the detective aware of Gamez's criminal record? Yes, the following morning.
6. Was the defendant's phone GPS location checked? No
7. What is Gamez also known as? Blue.
8. Defendant was arrested 2 ½ hours after the murder. Detective agrees that It is possible for the defendant to have left before the murder. Due to the impossibility of his location in relation to the Lamplighter motel. Tamezcano was on foot and if on foot would have taken 4 and a half hours to get to the arrest location. Which is impossible to do in the 2 and a half hours time frame.
9. Detective is aware that the witnesses had 20 minutes to get

their story straight and then came back to give witness statements.

10. Detective never got a warrant for Tamezcano's GPS phone location despite the cellphone being in state custody as evidence. The GPS location history would show the time and place as well as the route taken by Tamezcano.
11. Detective did get a warrant for Duran's cell phone info and found no connection to Tamezcano whatsoever.

Conclusion all evidence seems to point to Tamezcano having not been there at the time of the shooting.

1. The fingerprint and palmprint only show he was there at some point.
2. No motive, no connection to Duran.
3. Tested Negative for Gunpowder residue, analysis of Tamezcano's clothes also tested negative for Duran's Blood.
4. Clothes did not match the description,
5. The detective admits Tamezcano could not have been at the Lamplighter Motel and at the Arrest address within the same timeframe.

What the analysis does show is that Gamez was convicted of a similar crime.

1. Gamez admits to fleeing the scene.
2. Gamez admits to hiding for 20 minutes at a storage facility.
3. Gamez had the Girls pick him up presumably in his black Dodge charger.

4. The possibility that the other witnesses are accomplices is high.
5. The other women could be under threat by Gamez. It may be the reason for the other witnesses failing in showing up at trial.
6. Gamez and Jaime agree on the events of the shooting.
7. However, they point to Gamez as the Shooter.
8. Gamez is also known as Blue.
9. Jamie is currently missing.
10. Elizabeth who was an ex of Tamezcano has passed away from an overdose.
11. But as for Tamezcano, there is insufficient evidence to have convicted him of murder and the jury's verdict seems to have been due to Amber Moore's prejudicial way of presenting supposed evidence and the way she purposefully confused the jury.
12. Amber stated to the jury that all the elements of the murder charge had been proven.
13. Amber also made use of the long list of government employees investigating the case to confuse the jury.
14. The jury was told that Amber Moore had admissible evidence proving Tamezcano murdered Duran.
15. Amber stated to the jury that Tamezcano was guilty and that all elements of the charge had been proven. That statement was not backed by evidence.
16. The jury was misled by Amber Moore into convicting Tamezcano without a single credible witness.

Not even an actual explanation of what took place that night.

17. Ignorance of the law is no excuse for any citizen in a court of law. Thus Amber Moore can not claim ignorance of the laws that guarantee a defendant due process of law and fair and impartial trial by jury. Lastly, Amber Moore took From Tamezcano the right to face an accuser and cross-examine them under oath. Gamez was not a witness and his testimony was impeached by the defendant's attorney. Amber Moore did not disclose this to the jury.
18. His right to a speedy trial was definitely violated.
19. Amber Moore knew that there was insufficient evidence to convict Tamezcano so Amber used the witness testimony of Gamez AKA BLUE. A convicted criminal, who demonstrated he told lies during his testimony and possibly proved he is the real killer.
20. Was there no oversight of Amber's case from the newly elected John Creuzot? Is this going to become a common occurrence? Are killers going to walk free in Dallas county? You be the judge....however, this case did not seek justice or closure, rather Amber Moore simply did not want to have to admit that Tamezcano was innocent. Amber refused to correct her wrongs and used the ignorance of the jury to obtain a conviction. Despite insufficient evidence to sustain a guilty verdict.
