Students are given a computer upon enrollment to use during their enrollment at BOSS

- Will accept following documents as Proof of Residency: Utility Bill, Mortgage Statement, Lease or Rental Agreement, Original Mortgage/Closing Paperwork such as the Housing & Urban Development (HUD) Statement

Once your student is pre-registered, you will receive a call from our academic advising staff (within 24-48 hours) and receive a laptop in 3-5 business days.

Academics:

-Students are required to log on to school for 5 hours every day. There is a schedule of when the live classes are. Students can attend in the am or pm. If students have appointments during the day, recordings of all classes are available. Watching those recordings counts the time.

- Teachers have Targeted Help Sessions daily for extra help. Those are live sessions also. We have a high school tutoring program that student who are struggling have been invited to.

- OHDELA has several programs to meet the needs of IEP students, dependent on the level of need and disabilities. Accommodations for 504's are met as well.

- OHDELA has local testing sites for the OST and EOC exams in Summit County

- Students are provided with Chromebook and some families may be eligible for internet reimbursement. Find more information here:

- Proof of Residency: Utility bill, Mortgage statement from the last 90 days or lease agreement, Property tax statement, Homeowner's / renter's insurance policy declaration page, Rent receipt from the last 90 days, Bank statement from the last 90 days, Paycheck or paystub from the last 90 days, Letter from a government agency dated within 90 days

- Grades K-9 need recent report card from the recent school year

Grades K-12, ages 5-21

Academics:

- Students will need to be available for teacher-led Live lesson sessions, but are able to choose how to arrange their free time in between.
- To meet attendance requirements, students must work 5.5 hours and complete 4–6 self-guided lessons each school day
- Students are required to complete State Mandated Testing. The law states testing sites need to be located within 50 air miles of where our students reside; however, OCA strives to make testing as stress-free as possible and will offer many test site location choices across the state.
- Offers gifted, honors, and AP classes.
- There are a number of opportunities for you to take part in activities, both online and in person. Community coordinators and school staff plan field trips, special projects, and group meetings with other families in your area. Online discussion groups and the private email system allow you to communicate with other students or parents from all Connections Academy schools.
- Services are available for students with disabilities. Works with students with IEPs.

Ohio Virtual Academy

Enrollment:

Apply online. Parents will create an online portal and submit documentation. Parents will get notified anywhere between 48-72 hrs regarding their application status.

Grades K-12, ages 5-21

Academics:

- Students can pick either 7:30am-2:30pm or 8:00am-3:00pm.

- Students Schedules are split into 2 sessions throughout the day. Online and Offline Sessions. Online Sessions is when the child will be in a virtual classroom with the teacher and other students. During the Offline Session that is where the students will be completing textbook work and submitting it. The school provides the textbooks. Each student will receive a schedule with the Online and Offline Setup Schedule.
- Students are expected to log in for 5-6 hours a day. They do allow for breaks for switching classes and to eat lunch.

-There is NO official tutoring or any after school tutoring options. If a teacher feels a student needs tutoring, they will add 101 Tutoring to a student's schedule. Tutoring will continue until grades improve. Parents also can request tutoring if they feel their child is struggling, but once again the students schedule will be modified.

-State Testing is done in the Spring and is held at various locations. They take all their students home addresses and AVERAGE them out to determine testing sites. She stated some students had to travel over 45 miles to test this Spring.

-Schedules are made once a year by teacher or counselors online, but can be modified to the student's needs. They do work with students with IEP's and that is discussed during the intake meeting.

-The steps they take when a student is no longer engaging in school. 1) They locked the students account, the parent has to call, and an intervention meeting is held. 2) If that doesn't work, they withdraw the student. 3) Truancy is then filed.

Technology Requirements

-QDA does not provide an Internet connection (we provide Internet Reimbursement instead). It is the parent/guardian's responsibility to obtain reliable Internet access. Students can use a QDA Chromebook while enrolled. Chromebooks will only be issued after orientation is completed and the student is officially enrolled.

Academics:

-While students are required to meet attendance requirements, there are no designated class times so students can create their own schedule. QDA instructors host weekly video conferencing calls and tutors are available to assist students.

-QDA offers a special department that works with students who have IEPs & 504 plans

-For Ohio State Testing requirements students that reside within a 50 mile radius can come into the office for testing. Offices are located in E. Liverpool, New Philadelphia, and Steubenville.

Time 4 Learning

Time4Learning is an online PreK-12 **homeschool curriculum** covering math, language arts, science, and social studies. Unlike virtual schools with teachers, we empower you to take control of when, where, and how your child learns.

Once the application is complete, students are **required** to attend an orientation session at a TRECA regional office. This session will last approximately three hours. You will be invited to an orientation once your application file is complete. Students are **not** enrolled in TRECA Digital Academy until they attend an orientation. At the end of the orientation, students take home their computer equipment (computer, scanner, etc.).

Records required on the day of student orientation:

- Copy of birth certificate or hospital record
- Immunization records or completed exemption form.
- Proof of Ohio residency. Document must include the full physical address, full date (month/day/year), and legal guardian's name.
- Copy of custody order or divorce decree (if applicable). Under Ohio law, proof of custody must be provided to TRECA for any student for which custody has been determined by a court. Please provide entire document with court stamp and judge's signature, including any operation or shared parenting plans.

Records that must be submitted within 14 days:

- Test Scores (with Ohio State Proficiency Test)
- Most recent Grade Card, showing grade level attained
- Home Schooling Documentation (if applicable)
- Special Needs (IEP and ETR/MFE) Documentation

****Failure to provide required records can result in a delay in enrollment and a second orientation to be scheduled.**

Academics:

-Teachers can be reached by email, phone, or web-based interactive classrooms during office hours. Parents and students are encouraged to contact teachers as often as they wish. Students who choose to receive an iPhone will also have access to their teachers via text messaging.

-Students are given the ability to work at their own pace. This empowers them to work ahead and potentially earn more than the typical five credit hours each school year. Upon completion of a course, students will have the opportunity to enroll immediately into the next required course for graduation.

-All students take the Ohio's state mandated tests regardless of the school they attend. We provide students with dates, times, and convenient locations for testing.

Special Needs Students:

-TRECA will provide a licensed intervention specialist and individualized instructional programming to students identified as having a disability who have an IEP. TRECA will also provide specified services such as speech therapy, occupational therapy, and/or physical therapy.

slipped after filming herself with a noose around her neck and attempting to fasten it to a ceiling fan.

9. Mother has been both verbally and physically aggressive with SCCS staff and has made openly racist comments to SCCS staff. Mother stated that there is a gun in the home and the children know how to access it if they need to defend themselves.
10. SCCS did not hold a team decision making meeting due to the safety factor of Mother being physically and verbally aggressive with SCCS staff. SCCS does believe that it would be in the best interests of the children to be in the emergency temporary custody of SCCS. Mother does not believe that mental health is a "real thing" and does not want to engage in services. Mother admitted to beating Jacob with a belt which is concerning as he is non-verbal and aggressive at school. Mother is not treating her own mental health and has acknowledged to stealing things if she needs something. There is also a firearm in the home that the children are able to access. Mother has extensive history in Florida and recently moved to Ohio a couple of years ago. There are community members who are very worried about the safety of the children and whether their needs are being met.
11. SCCS has made reasonable efforts to prevent the initial removal of the children by meeting with Mother, attempting to interview the children, assessing the home, viewing records from Florida, speaking with school officials, finding placements, and on-going case management.
12. The children are neglected under O.R.C. 2151.03(A)(2)(3)(4) and dependent under O.R.C. 2151.04(B)(C).
13. SCCS does not have any reason to believe that these are Indian Children.

2. It was reported to SCCS that Mother does not have food in her home or electricity. Jacob has only been in school 4 days this school year. Jacob has special needs, he is non-verbal and is VERY aggressive. He is to attend Bridges, but Mother will not send him, because she stated that he will be abused there. He has been at Robinson this week (09/26/22 to 09/29/22), but is not able to remain, due to being too aggressive. There is a meeting today(09/29/22) at 1pm with Mother to inform of her of that Jacob will be attending Educational Alternatives. Zion who attend Buchtel Middle School as a 6th grader has missed 8 days and has been tardy all the other days. He has special needs too, but is verbal.
3. On September 22, 2022 Mother was observed talked to people that were not present and there are concerns that she has schizophrenia. The police had to be called due to Mother's escalated behavior. Mother has been offered a resource for Summit DD, but she does not trust the government and has never followed through to engage. The family moved to Ohio from Florida last year, because "people had eyes on her" (CPS).
4. On September 30, 2022 two SCCS staff went to Mother's home to begin the intake investigation. Mother was at the home and was advised of the allegations in the intake report. Mother then got out of her car and got into the face of both SCCS staff and began yelling at them stating that they "need to f'ing call before you just come to my house". SCCS was able to see the two younger children who came onto the porch. SCCS advised Mother that they could provide a food box if one was needed but both workers left the home due to the escalation of Mother.
5. The SCCS worker did call Mother back that afternoon to talk with her over the phone. Mother did send the SCCS worker a text that showed food and electricity working in the home. There was also a meeting arranged for October 3, 2022.
6. On October 3, 2022 two SCCS staff met with Mother in the home. Mother stated that she disciplines Jacob by beating him with a belt. Jacob is very aggressive at school and they have tried to address this with Mother. Mother is thinking about having him home schooled. Mother admitted that if she needed something for the home that she could just steal it. During the meeting someone called Mother and while she had the phone on speakerphone the speaker asked Mother if she wanted to go and drop off "a pack". Mother stated that the SCCS workers were not supposed to hear that. Mother acknowledges that she smokes THC. Mother states that she gets SSI for two of her kids but could not state why she gets the money. Mothers stated that the children were seen at Child Guidance for one day before she pulled them out as they were asking too many questions. Mother does know what her mental health diagnosis is. Mother stated that even though Jacob is non-verbal she does not think that he is non-verbal because she can understand him. SCCS did meet with Jacob and he is not able to communicate.
7. Mother stated that while in Florida Mr. Bazin raped her children and this would have occurred several years ago. She stated she found out because her daughter told her they were raped but her daughter was only one years old at the time it allegedly happened. SCCS did verify that there is no Florida report of this happening either with children services or with law enforcement.
8. Mother has extensive history with both children services and criminal issues in the State of Florida stemming back from when she was a child and an adult. Most of the issues stemmed from her mental health. Mother does have a past diagnosis of bipolar disorder, depression, and anxiety. Mother did threaten suicide in 2018 and in 2019 she was pink-

At the time of the intake report the family was residing at 575 Fernwood Dr. Akron, OH 44320 in Summit County.

MAGISTRATE'S ORDER

This cause came before Mary Ann Mendlik for SHELTER CARE on May 26, 2023.

STEVEN BAZIN (ALLEGED FATHER) was notified of the hearing, but did not attend.

All parents and custodians present were advised of the following right(s):

- to an attorney, and to apply for a court-appointed attorney if they are indigent.
- to have the child(ren) placed with appropriate relatives over agency foster care.
- to have Children Services prove that the child(ren) was/were at immediate risk or threatened physical or emotional harm warranting removal.
- to have the court determine their reasonable visitation with the child during this interim period.
- The parties are advised that pursuant to Local Rule 8.02(B), the Court appointed counsel for each party at the initial hearing. If any party fails to complete the financial affidavit by the adjudicatory hearing scheduled as stated below, the appointment of counsel for that party will be terminated.

The parties are hereby notified that his or her failure to reapply for court-appointed counsel and complete the financial affidavit required for the appointment of counsel will be considered a knowing, intelligent and voluntary waiver of the right to appointed counsel.

Findings:

- Mother was served personally in open court with a summons and copy of the complaint by a deputy sheriff.

In support of Summit County Children Services' request for emergency temporary custody to Summit County Children Services, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Tomko presented the sworn testimony of Leah Sewell. Mother also testified. No further evidence was presented to the Court.

Upon review of the evidence before the Court, the Court finds that Summit County Children Services established probable cause for the removal and to issue the following temporary orders in order to protect the child from immediate or threatened physical harm. Summit County Children Services received a referral regarding the child due to mother's untreated mental health issues and concerns that

mother was not meeting the child's special educational and other special needs. This is the 4th referral regarding the family for these concerns. The child is developmentally delayed and was receiving services through a Pre-Kindergarten program until mother stopping taking the child to the program. Mother was previously referred to the Board of Developmental Disabilities to have the child assessed for services which mother never followed through with as of this date. Paternity is not established and the only named alleged father reportedly resides in Dayton. No other man claiming to be the child's father has contacted SCCS or otherwise appeared in this matter.

The Court notes that an order was issued on May 25, 2023, placing the child in the emergency temporary custody of Summit County Children Services and when SCCS went to remove the child from mother's custody, the child could not be found and even when ordered by the Court in open court mother continued to refuse to provide the location of the child or to otherwise provide SCCS with access to the child in order to assess the child's condition and safety.

Because of exigent circumstances, reasonable efforts could not be made to maintain the Child in the home. The Child's return to the home at this time is contrary to the Child's best interests.

Orders:

1. The Child shall remain in the emergency temporary custody of Summit County Children Services.
2. An attorney shall be appointed to represent each parent or legal custodian if he/she qualifies under the Court guidelines for indigence and makes a request in person to the Juvenile Court Bailiff, 650 Dan Street, Akron, Ohio 44310. If a parent is incarcerated or otherwise unable to appear in person, the request for appointment of counsel may be made in writing.
3. An attorney shall be appointed in the limited role of guardian ad litem for the Children in Case Nos. DN 23-5-450, 451 and 452.
4. Mother shall immediately provide the location of the child to Summit County Children Services or bring the child to Summit County Children Services.
5. Summit County Children Services shall file a Notice within 7 days of the date of this order stating whether the child has been located or what efforts have been made to locate the child.
6. Mother shall have SUPERVISED visitation as arranged by Summit County Children Services pending further order of court.
7. The Akron Public School District is responsible for the costs of educating Miyonni Bazin. At the time the Child was removed from parental custody, the Child's Mother resided at 575 Fernwood, Akron, Ohio 44320, located in the Akron Public School District. This order is subject to re-determination by the Department of Education pursuant to R.C. 2151.362(A)(2).
8. All prior orders not inconsistent herein shall remain in full force and effect.

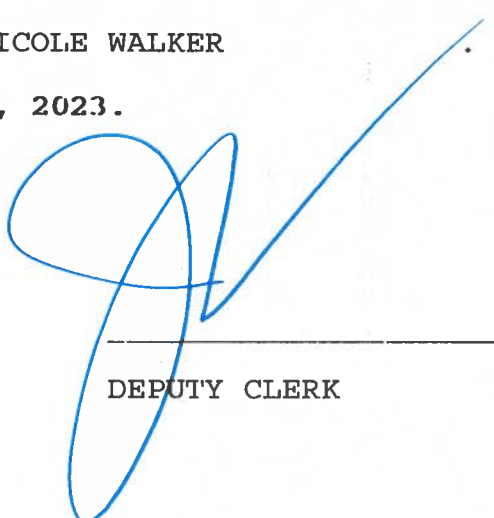

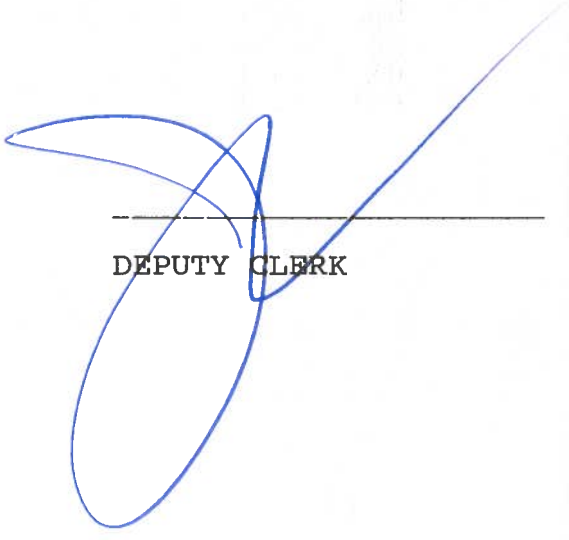

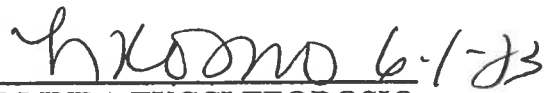

CONCERN (1 of 3)

1. What are the concerns/needs for the family?

Zion was in the 6th grade in Buchtel. He was withdrawn due to non-attendance in Feb 2023. Zion is a special needs student designated as having multiple disabilities.

Zion has an IQ of 51 which is in the extremely low range with only 1% of the population having a lower IQ. He requires close supervision and engages in a highly modified curriculum with adaptive physical education. Zion has low adaptive skills and high distractibility. Mother believes that Zion has Down's Syndrome and suspects he has a hearing issue, however there is no documentation to support she has ever followed through with getting him appropriate medical attention. Because of Ms. Wright's refusal to send the children to school, APS arranged for specially designed home instruction, however Ms. Wright also refused to allow anyone in her home. Zion is supposed to be receiving direct speech and language pathology services however does not receive that needed therapy due to Ms. Wright's refusal.

Jacob was in the 1st grade at Robinson. Ms. Wright withdrew him in October 2022 due to her belief that the school was abusing him. APS reports that Jacob was at risk of being expelled due to his extreme disability and dangerous behaviors. Jacob gets physical with others and cusses. APS had Jacob on home instruction and planned to place him at Educational Alternatives for intensive behavioral interventions and education prior to Ms. Wright withdrawing him.

Jacob's receptive and expressive language skills are significantly delayed. He is non verbal. Ms. Wright reported a concern regarding Jacob's hearing however no documentation was received related to a hearing screen or doctor visit. School based related services, such as speech and language pathology, physical therapy, and occupational therapy were suspended while Ms. Wright had Jacob on home instruction. Jacob was participating in a modified curriculum with significant accommodations and the use of an augmentative communication device.

In Oct 2022, Mother stated that she does not think that Jacob is non-verbal because she can understand him, despite his being intelligible generally. SCCS did meet with Jacob at that time and he was not able to communicate. At that time, Zion who was 11 years old could not share what his name was, what age he was, or what grade he was in. He appeared to be functioning as a toddler.

Miyonni will start Kindergarten in the fall. She appears developmentally on track.

Ms. Wright believes that she is under no obligation to send her children to school and that she does not have to abide by the laws of this state, as they do not apply to her. Ms. Wright believes her children have been abused at school but has made no effort to have them educated at home.

2. What does the family and Worker want to see happen to address the identified concerns/needs?

Zion, Jacob, and Miyonni will have all their physical, emotional, cognitive, schooling and medical needs met on a consistent basis. Ms. Wright will demonstrate and have an understanding of how to protect their children and in no way place them at risk. Ms. Wright will demonstrate that they have the ability to provide emotional, financial, and physical support for the children.

3. What is causing these concerns/needs for the family?

Zion, Jacob, and Miyonni are vulnerable and rely on their caregiver to meet all of their basic needs. Zion and Jacob have special medical and/or developmental needs.

Historical records from Florida, where Mother has an extensive child welfare history, reveal that Mother has bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, and learning disabilities. Ms. Wright did threaten suicide in 2018 and in 2019 she was pink-slipped after filming herself with a noose around her neck and attempting to fasten it to a ceiling fan. Ms. Wright has told the children in the past that SCCS has kidnapped them.

Ms. Wright told both police and the court that she would physically assault any SCCS worker that came to her home. Ms. Wright was observed to be yelling at police officers and was being held back from assaulting them by another woman at the home. Police advised SCCS workers that they should not approach the home due to Ms. Wright's mental state. After several failed attempts, Ms. Wright called the worker and asked why SCCS keeps coming to her home. Ms. Wright told the worker that she worked for the Klu Klux Klan and that worker was attempting to traffick her children. Ms. Wright ultimately told the worker not to return to her home because she is not breaking any laws. Caseworker had to end the call because Ms. Wright would not stop yelling and cussing at her. At another attempt, while workers were parked away from the home and waiting on police assistance, Ms. Wright came running out of her home, jumped in her car and began following the workers who pulled away when they realized Ms. Wright's intention.

Ms. Wright was charged with 6 CE and 6 interfering with custody.

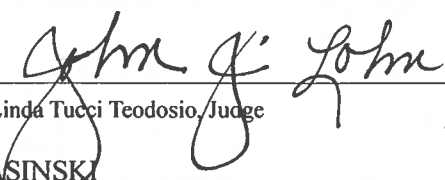
