Pursuant to Rule 4.1(e) of the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure, the undersigned affiant(s), being duly sworn, deposes and says that there is reason to believe that the above-named person has committed the above offense(s) on or around December 22, 2021, in Baxter County, Arkansas against the peace and dignity of the State of Arkansas.

On Wednesday, December 22, 2021 Sergeant Michael Holland, Deputy George Hinson and Deputy Timothy King made a traffic stop at the intersection of Highway 5 North and County Road 903. During the stop the passenger was not wearing a seatbelt. Deputy Hinson asked the female passenger for her identification. The female advised she did not have identification on her and told the deputies that she was a Sovereign Citizen and refused to provide her name and date of birth. Deputy Hinson stated she violated Arkansas traffic law when she did not have a seatbelt on, while the vehicle was in motion. Deputy Hinson stated he went to the passenger door, opened it and asked the female to exit the vehicle, but she refused to comply. Deputy Hinson advised he attempted to get the female out of the vehicle and she ripped her body away from Deputy Hinson's grasp. Deputy Hinson stated the female continued to resist arrest and kicked him in his knee with her leg. Deputy Hinson advised he and Deputy King was able to gain control of the female and placed her in hand restraints and transported her to Deputy Hinson's patrol unit for transport to the Baxter County Sheriff's Office Jail.

Once at the jail the female was identified as Elizabeth Violet Sanders through A.C.I.C. records. Jail Staff began to process Ms. Sanders purse that was brought into the jail, and it was discovered that there was a white substance in a torn piece of paper at the bottom of the purse. Deputy Hinson stated he collected the white powdery substance and filled tested it. The substance tested positive for Methamphetamine.

I Investigator Brian Williams processed the evidence, which had an aggregate weight of .67 grams. I did not field test the substance, because Deputy Hinson already did so. The evidence is being sent to the Arkansas Crime Lab for complete analysis.

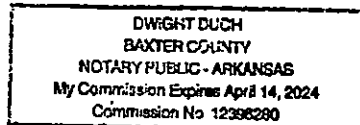
