NARRATIVE-

Reporting Officer: **ANTORINO, MICHAEL 2120**

Investigation:

On 04/16/22 at approximately 2149 hours, I, Greenwood Village Police Officer M. Antorino responded emergent (with my marked patrol vehicles emergency lighting and sirens activated pursuant to Greenwood Village Police Department policy), to Extended Stay located at 5200 S Quebec St, Greenwood Village, Arapahoe County, Colorado, in reference to an in-progress disturbance. Dispatch advised a female had brandished a taser, to a male subject who was associated with room 314. The female in question was described as a short black female, wearing a white t-shirt, and the male subject was described as an older, tall, skinny black male, wearing a white t-shirt.

Upon arrival, Officer Beachem and me contacted two subjects matching the above stated descriptions, in the parking lot area of the above stated Extended Stay. At this time, I observed the male subject acting extremely animated, who was currently hitting a nearby parked vehicle, with some unknown object.

While Officer Beachem spoke the male subject, already known to officers from prior incidents as Michael Nixon; DOB: 06/20/59, I spoke with the female subject, also already known to officers from prior incidents as Yaleca Shelby; DOB: 09/01/75.

Upon speaking with Yaleca, she advised me of the following:

Today (at an unknown time), Yaleca was at her hotel room located at 9253 E Costilla Ave, Greenwood Village, Arapahoe County, Colorado, when Michael texted her to come over to his room located at the above stated location of incident.

Upon arrival, Yaleca was speaking with Michael inside of room 314, when Michael became irate with Yaleca, which started a verbal

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argument between the two. At some point during this verbal argument, Michael allegedly grabbed Yaleca's iPhone from her hands, and threw it on the ground causing it to break. Yaleca had her phone clutched with both her hands, when Michael had grabbed ahold of the phone with his right hand.

Yaleca advised Michael allegedly twisted her fingers causing small cuts while doing so, but upon observation of Yaleca's fingers, I did not observe any injuries, bruising, swelling, cuts, etc.

Yaleca then advised at an unknown time after the alleged phone throwing incident, Yaleca was sitting on the bed, while Michael was allegedly standing overtop of her (approximately 2 feet from her face as his back was to the front hotel room door), as he proceeded to verbally insult her. At this time, Michael was allegedly telling Yaleca to take her clothes off, and insinuating that he wanted to have sexual relations with Yaleca. While Yaleca sat there on the bed refusing Michael's alleged advances, Yaleca advised she felt as if Michael was preventing her from leaving.

Approximately after 15 minutes of sitting on the bed, Yaleca removed a taser from her right pants pocket, and presented it to Michael. This caused Michael to step away from her enough to give her space to exit the hotel room.

Once outside, Michael became irate, and grabbed a nearby object (can of Cedar Woods Scented Glade Aerosol can), and began to repeatedly hit the exterior of Yaleca's parked and stationary Acura sedan (unknown how many times Michael actually hit her vehicle with the glade aerosol can).

Upon completion of speaking with Yaleca, I was able to speak with a sight and sound witness, who observed a majority of the above stated incident. Upon speaking with the witness, who identified herself to me as Georgia Conover; DOB: 12/16/83, Georgia advised me of the following:

Today (at an unknown time), Georgia was standing outside of her room (240) of the same above stated Extended Stay. While standing outside of her room, Georgia observed Yaleca driving/backing up her above stated Acura sedan, away from where it was currently parked (in front of Michael's hotel room 314). Georgia's room is on the second floor of a building, which faces the front of Michael's hotel room.

While Yaleca was attempting to back up, Georgia observed Michael with a knife (in his right hand) attempting to stab Yaleca's vehicle tires as she was backing up. After failing at attempting to stab the tires, Michael then threw the knife, which landed approximately two feet away from where Georgia's vehicle was currently parked and stationary.

Yaleca then reversed and backed up her vehicle to the parking lot area nearest to the street (S Quebec St). Yaleca then proceeded to drive back up towards Michael's hotel room, appearing to antagonize him, and then backing up again when Michael approached her.

Yaleca proceeded to do this a few times, each time appearing to be baiting Michael to exit his room, and reengage in conversation with her (unknown exactly how many times Yaleca reversed, and then drove back up to Michael's room).

After approximately the third or fourth time, Yaleca drove back towards Michael's room, and parked her vehicle. Yaleca then opened her car door, placed something into her right pants pocket (appearing to be a taser), and then entered Michael's hotel room by opening the front door. It did not appear that Yaleca had to force entry, as the front door was closed but unlocked. Upon entering the room, Yaleca then shut the door behind her.

After approximately a couple minutes or so, Yaleca and Michael exited the hotel room, where Yaleca was seen pointing her taser towards Michael, and "setting it off" multiple times at him (unknown exactly how many times she sparked her taser towards Michael). Yaleca did not make contact with Michael's person, while sparking her taser at him.

Georgia also advised Michael was attempting to confine Yaleca in the immediate area, and preventing her from leaving, as she was actively trying to leave and parking lot area (unknown exactly how long he confined her for).

Georgia was able to provide a written statement, and also able to show me some of the video surveillance she captured from her exterior hotel room cameras. Due to the fact that these cameras are not continuously recording, I was only able to view footage of Yaleca driving up towards Michael's room, putting the taser into her right pants pocket, and then entering the said hotel room.

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Although both parties told officers conflicting stories (see Officer Coleman's report for information regarding Michael's statements), officers were able to determine that both parties were at fault (for different charges), due to the verbal and written statements provided by sight and sound witness Georgia.

I proceeded to serve Yaleca citation (134163) for the following charge: menacing 9-8-10. After explaining Yaleca the specifics of the citation, Yaleca took possession of the citation and left the scene without incident. Yaleca was also advised she was trespassed indefinitely from the above stated Extended Stay (see Corporal Cordova's report for more information regarding this).

I then served Michael citation (143164) for the following charge: False Imprisonment (misdemeanor) 18-3-303. Upon explaining Michael the specifics of the citation, Michael became verbally combative, and began speaking to me in an aggressive and loud tone of voice. Michael also advised he would not be willing to sign the citation. The citation was signed as "served" by me, and then touch served to Michael, who was still adamant on not accepting the citation.

Michael proceeded to crumple up the citation in his hands, and then threw it on the ground outside of his hotel room door. Officers advised Michael that was littering, and Michael then slammed his hotel room door shut and went inside.

This concludes my involvement in this incident.

Additional Information:

The written statements provided by Yaleca and Georgia were later scanned and attached to this incident.

Officers were unable to substantiate criminal mischief charges to the alleged phone throwing incident.

Photographs were taken of the lack of injury to Yaleca's hands, and the lack of damage done to Yaleca's car by the aerosol can, which were later logged into evidence.

The knife which Michael threw, was also photographed, collected, and later logged into evidence along with the photographs (by Corporal Cordova).

The taser was also seized and later booked into evidence by Corporal Cordova.

NARRATIVE-

Reporting Officer: **CORDOVA, WES 13-10**

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT:

On 04/16/2022 at about 2149 hours I responded to cover Officer Mike Antorino for a report of a disturbance in progress at the Extended Stay hotel located at 5200 S. Quebec St. #314.

Dispatch advised a male and female were arguing in the parking lot and a female was chasing a male subject with a "Taser". I was busy on another call for service so my response was delayed.

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Upon my arrival Officer Mike Antorino was with a female subject outside of building 2 and Officer Robin Coleman was with a male subject outside of room 314, Officer Bryan Beachem was also on scene. I recognized both the male and female as people we had dealt with in the past, Yaleca Shelby DOB: 09/01/1975 and Michael Nixon DOB: 06/20/1959. I spoke with Antorino who briefed me on what he had discovered so far. He then went to speak with a witness while I stayed with Shelby.

I asked Shelby what had happened and she said:

- A verbal argument tonight resulted in Nixon threatening her with bodily injury.
- She said she would call Police so Nixon grabbed her hand/wrist, took her phone from her hand and smashed it on the ground.
- He tried to prevent her from leaving the room so she grabbed her stun gun and sparked it at him so he backed off.
- She left the room and got into her car to leave.
- She was preparing to leave but stopped and went back to the room to retrieve her phone.
- Nixon tried to stab her tires and was pounding on her rear windshield.
- Nixon was preventing her from getting into her car again so she had to spark her stun gun again to be able to leave.
- Police arrived on scene.

I asked Shelby to complete a written statement which she did and provided to Antorino. Shelby said she had painful scratches on her hands and showed me her hands. I saw absolutely no sign of scratches on her hands. Antorino later photographed her hands. I also spoke to Nixon. Nixon appeared to be under the influence of alcohol as his speech was slurred and I could smell the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. Nixon was boisterous and was constantly using profanity. Nixon refused to complete a written statement and would only insult Shelby when speaking about her. Nixon said that Shelby was a liar and was not telling us the truth. He also said that Shelby had stolen his phone. He denied any kind of conflict other than a verbal argument. Someone had told me that Nixon had pointed an "aerosol can" at Shelby and I confirmed it was a can of air freshener.

While speaking to Nixon I called Shelby's phone to see if it would ring inside of Nixon's room but I did not hear it ring. I saw remnants of what looked to be a shattered phone screen on the floor and when I told Nixon this he started to sweep it up. After speaking with Nixon I then went back to Shelby. I called Nixon's phone number as well but it did not ring. Shelby turned out her pockets and she was not in possession of his phone. I removed the black Vipertek stun gun from her right jacket pocket. The stun gun was still powered on and I pressed the button to confirm that it was functioning and it sparked. I then seized it as evidence.

Antorino advised the weapon that Nixon used to attempt to slash Shelby's tire was laying in the parking lot and a witness had seen him throw it after the attempt. Antorino seized that as well and I later booked it and the stun gun into evidence, see property sheet. The knife was a large "Martha Stewart" knife/gardening shovel with a long serrated "blade".

I consulted with Antorino and he advised me that upon his arrival he witnessed Nixon slamming the aerosol can into Shelby's rear window. The independent witness stated that she observed Nixon and Shelby in the parking lot and Nixon preventing Shelby from getting into her vehicle. She said that Shelby sparked the stun gun at Nixon who backed off. Shelby then left the area but continuously was driving back to the area taunting and re-engaging with Nixon. She said she then witnessed Shelby enter Nixon's room again and come out shortly after again sparking the stun gun at him which was shortly before Police arrive. The witness completed a written statement which was provided to Antorino.

While Antorino was completing summonses for Nixon and Shelby I requested hotel management respond to advise them of the situation. I advised the night clerk of the situation and he stated he wanted Shelby trespass from the property since she is not a guest. He said he would tell his manager about Nixon and she would make the decision to trespass him or not.

I explained to Shelby that she was trespass and should not return to the property or she could be cited for trespassing, she said she understood and Antorino issued her a summons. Afterward we escorted Shelby to her vehicle which was parked directly in front of Nixon's room. Nixon continuously was yelling profanities at Shelby and calling her names while she was leaving the area. I remained at the scene while Antorino service Nixon a summons as well, he refused to take possession of the summons so Antorino set it inside of the door to his room. Nixon then crumpled the citation and threw it on the ground as he was upset. I admonished him and warned him that he needed to pick it up or be cited for littering. He picked it up and went into his room before coming out of his room again crumpling up the ticket and throwing it on the ground. Officers then left the area.

NARRATIVE-

Reporting Officer: **COLEMAN, ROBIN 21-18**

Investigation:

On 04/16/2022 at approximately 2150 hours, I was on call for service GV22003255 when dispatch toned out a physical disturbance that occurred at 5200 South Quebec Street in the city of Greenwood Village, State of Colorado. I deactivated my body worn camera and unit 944's camera from that incident and re-activated it for this report. I activated my emergency lights and siren after leaving the neighborhood from the area of South Dayton Street and East Belleview Avenue. Dispatch aired that there was a male and female fighting in the parking lot. The female had a taser out and threatening the male with it.

I arrived on-scene a short time later after Officer Beachem and Officer Antorino. I had my red and blue emergency lights activated in the parking lot and parked very close to Officer Beachem's marked patrol car. I looked around to make sure I wasn't blocking an occupied vehicle which I wasn't. I got out of my vehicle and went to where Officer Beachem was standing with a male. I then heard a male yell at me, "You are f***** blocking me." I told them I wasn't and that I was there on a call and could move my car in a little bit. The male then yelled, "You f***** b****." I then said, I'm in no hurry now. Officer Beachem asked me what occurred and I asked him to move my patrol car while I spoke to the male who was involved in the incident so that the male in the white car would stop yelling at me and calling me a, "F**** b****." Officer Beachem went to move my car and was called various names by the same subject.

I focused on speaking to the male who was involved in the incident. I knew the male as Michael Nixon and had dealt with him during a civil incident a few weeks prior. Michael appeared intoxicated and there was also an odor of marijuana coming from his room. I asked Michael what happened. Michael just told me that he wouldn't hit a woman and wasn't that kind of man. Michael then began to have random conversation with me. Eventually I asked again about the incident. Michael told me that he used a Glade aerosol can and had it in his hand because his female, "Friend" who he only had relations with, pulled a taser on him and tried to tase him. This upset Michael and agitated him, so he grabbed the Glade and went outside after the female. At one point (Michael wasn't clear) he hit the female's car with the Glade can but didn't say why.

I asked Michael what happened with the knife and pointed to the parking lot. Michael said that he tried to damage the female's car with it but missed, so when she drove away at first, he threw the knife at her tire and again missed. Michael didn't go into the parking lot to retrieve the knife. Michael didn't really want to talk about the incident just that he used the female to sexual intercourse and she was, "Bipolar." Michael knew her for years and they lived together in Louisiana and came to Colorado to work together. Michael felt obligated to help her as long as she helped him. I asked him why he didn't leave when he had the first issue with her and he laughed and said that she kept having intercourse with him, which made him happy. However Michael was upset that the female was on her period and he couldn't have intercourse with him and was upset that she got blood on his sheets. I kept friendly conversation with Michael who talked about his military service and other worldly issues. Corporal Cordova asked Michael if he wanted to write a written statement as to what happened. Michael said, "F**** that." Michael said that it was a waste of our time and money being there for the incident.

Michael was hard to understand due to slurring words, however he was able to understand questions when I asked them. Michael was cooperative up until the time when Officer Antorino served him with a summons. Michael began to yell at both Corporal Cordova and Officer Antorino and called me, "Babe" and was friendly and even flirty towards me by winking and pointing. I told Michael to listen to them and to stop yelling. Michael didn't like that and became even more argumentative and loud. Officer Antorino served Michael with the summons and explained it to him. Officer Antorino had to place the summons inside the door because Michael wouldn't take it. Michael then took it from inside his room and threw the paper outside. Corporal Cordova explained firmly to Michael that he could also be cited for littering if he didn't stop.

Michael tried to go inside and slammed the door so hard that it wouldn't latch. Michael then went back outside and began yelling at officers and the female who was trying to leave (she was also served with a summons). I stood by my fully marked patrol car and yelled toward

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Michael to just go inside and shut the door, or I would go to the lobby of the hotel to let them know he was causing a disturbance and they could trespass him from the property as well. Michael became upset again and then slammed the door to where it latched. Officer Antorino and Corporal Cordova had to stand with the female to ensure she got into her car and left the property.

After the female left the property, Michael came out of his room again to yell. I could not hear what he was saying. I drove around the corner toward building one and deactivated my body worn camera and unit 944's and left the area.

NARRATIVE-

Reporting Officer: **BEACHEM, BRYAN 13-01**

On 04/17/2022, at approximately 2149 hours, GVPD dispatch aired a disturbance in progress call that was occurring at the Extended Stay hotel located at 5200 S. Quebec Street. I, Officer Beachem responded emergent as dispatch stated a female was chasing a male around the parking lot with a taser. I pulled on scene at the same time as Ofc. Antorino. I observed a black male and black female in the middle of the parking lot screaming at one another, she was walking towards him at a quick pace with her arms up, looking ready to fight.

The male had an aerosol can of glade room spray in his hand, he later stated he was going to use this to spray the female if need be to protect himself. The male later identified as Michael Nixon complied with all my orders when I first got on scene, I did a quick patdown of Nixon to make sure he was not armed with any weapons as dispatch stated a taser was involved. Nixon walked back to his room where I followed him. I had a very hard time understanding Nixon due to his accent and possibly being intoxicated. Nixon did not appear to have any wounds or physical marks from what I saw, he also refused medical attention. This specific evening I was working overtime doing street racer enforcement, because of this, I stood by and waited for patrol officers to show up to further speak with Nixon. Ofc. Coleman arrived a short time after I did. She took over the investigations with Nixon from there. A female standing outside smoking a cigarette on the top floor pointed my attention to a large blade shovel that was in the parking lot, she also stated she had cameras outside her room. I informed Ofc. Antorino of this since he was the primary Officer investigating the incident. I cleared the scene a short time later and returned to service doing street racer enforcement.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT:

On 04/16/2022 at about 2149 hours I responded to cover Officer Mike Antorino for a report of a disturbance in progress at the Extended Stay hotel located at 5200 S. Quebec St. #314.

Dispatch advised a male and female were arguing in the parking lot and a female was chasing a male subject with a "Taser". I was busy on another call for service so my response was delayed.

Upon my arrival Officer Mike Antorino was with a female subject outside of building 2 and Officer Robin Coleman was with a male subject outside of room 314, Officer Bryan Beachem was also on scene. I recognized both the male and female as people we had dealt with in the past, Yaleca Shelby DOB: 09/01/1975 and Michael Nixon DOB: 06/20/1959. I spoke with Antorino who briefed me on what he had discovered so far. He then went to speak with a witness while I stayed with Shelby.

I asked Shelby what had happened and she said:

- A verbal argument tonight resulted in Nixon threatening her with bodily injury.
- She said she would call Police so Nixon grabbed her hand/wrist, took her phone from her hand and smashed it on the ground.
- He tried to prevent her from leaving the room so she grabbed her stun gun and sparked it at him so he backed off.
- She left the room and got into her car to leave.
- She was preparing to leave but stopped and went back to the room to retrieve her phone.
- Nixon tried to stab her tires and was pounding on her rear windshield.
- Nixon was preventing her from getting into her car again so she had to spark her stun gun again to be able to leave.
- Police arrived on scene.

I asked Shelby to complete a written statement which she did and provided to Antorino. Shelby said she had painful scratches on her hands and showed me her hands. I saw absolutely no sign of scratches on her hands. Antorino later photographed her hands. I also spoke to Nixon. Nixon appeared to be under the influence of alcohol as his speech was slurred and I could smell the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath. Nixon was boisterous and was constantly using profanity. Nixon refused to complete a written statement and would only insult Shelby when speaking about her. Nixon said that Shelby was a liar and was not telling us the truth. He also said that Shelby had stolen his phone. He denied any kind of conflict other than a verbal argument. Someone had told me that Nixon had pointed an "aerosol can" at Shelby and I confirmed it was a can of air freshener.

While speaking to Nixon I called Shelby's phone to see if it would ring inside of Nixon's room but I did not hear it ring. I saw remnants of what looked to be a shattered phone screen on the floor and when I told Nixon this he started to sweep it up. After speaking with Nixon I then went back to Shelby. I called Nixon's phone number as well but it did not ring. Shelby turned out her pockets and she was not in possession of his phone. I removed the black Vipertek stun gun from her right jacket pocket. The stun gun was still powered on and I pressed the button to confirm that it was functioning and it sparked. I then seized it as evidence.

Antorino advised the weapon that Nixon used to attempt to slash Shelby's tire was laying in the parking lot and a witness had seen him throw it after the attempt. Antorino seized that as well and I later booked it and the stun gun into evidence, see property sheet. The knife was a large "Martha Stewart" knife/gardening shovel with a long serrated "blade".

I consulted with Antorino and he advised me that upon his arrival he witnessed Nixon slamming the aerosol can into Shelby's rear window. The independent witness stated that she observed Nixon and Shelby in the parking lot and Nixon preventing Shelby from getting into her vehicle. She said that Shelby sparked the stun gun at Nixon who backed off. Shelby then left the area but continuously was driving back to the area taunting and re-engaging with Nixon. She said she then witnessed Shelby

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enter Nixon's room again and come out shortly after again sparking the stun gun at him which was shortly before Police arrive. The witness completed a written statement which was provided to Antorino.

While Antorino was completing summonses for Nixon and Shelby I requested hotel management respond to advise them of the situation. I advised the night clerk of the situation and he stated he wanted Shelby trespass from the property since she is not a guest. He said he would tell his manager about Nixon and she would make the decision to trespass him or not.

I explained to Shelby that she was trespassed and should not return to the property or she could be cited for trespassing, she said she understood and Antorino issued her a summons. Afterward we escorted Shelby to her vehicle which was parked directly in front of Nixon's room. Nixon continuously was yelling profanities at Shelby and calling her names while she was leaving the area. I remained at the scene while Antorino service Nixon a summons as well, he refused to take possession of the summons so Antorino set it inside of the door to his room. Nixon then crumpled the citation and threw it on the ground as he was upset. I admonished him and warned him that he needed to pick it up or be cited for littering. He picked it up and went into his room before coming out of his room again crumpling up the ticket and throwing it on the ground. Officers then left the area.

NARRATIVE-

Investigation:

On 04/16/2022 at approximately 2150 hours, I was on call for service GV22003255 when dispatch toned out a physical disturbance that occurred at 5200 South Quebec Street in the city of Greenwood Village, State of Colorado. I deactivated my body worn camera and unit 944's camera from that incident and re-activated it for this report. I activated my emergency lights and siren after leaving the neighborhood from the area of South Dayton Street and East Bellevue Avenue. Dispatch aired that there was a male and female fighting in the parking lot. The female had a taser out and threatening the male with it.

I arrived on-scene a short time later after Officer Beachem and Officer Antorino. I had my red and blue emergency lights activated in the parking lot and parked very close to Officer Beachem's marked patrol car. I looked around to make sure I wasn't blocking an occupied vehicle which I wasn't. I got out of my vehicle and went to where Officer Beachem was standing with a male. I then heard a male yell at me, "You are f***** blocking me." I told them I wasn't and that I was there on a call and could move my car in a little bit. The male then yelled, "You f***** b*****." I then said, I'm in no hurry now. Officer Beachem asked me what occurred and I asked him to move my patrol car while I spoke to the male who was involved in the incident so that the male in the white car would stop yelling at me and calling me a, "F***** b*****." Officer Beachem went to move my car and was called various names by the same subject.

I focused on speaking to the male who was involved in the incident. I knew the male as Michael Nixon and had dealt with him during a civil incident a few weeks prior. Michael appeared intoxicated and there was also an odor of marijuana coming from his room. I asked Michael what happened. Michael just told me that he wouldn't hit a woman and wasn't that kind of man. Michael then began to have random conversation with me. Eventually I asked again about the incident. Michael told me that he used a Glade aerosol can and had it in his hand because his female, "Friend" who he only had relations with, pulled a taser on him and tried to tase him. This upset Michael and agitated him, so he grabbed the Glade and went outside after the female. At one point (Michael wasn't clear) he hit the female's car with the Glade can but didn't say why.

I asked Michael what happened with the knife and pointed to the parking lot. Michael said that he tried to damage the female's car with it but missed, so when she drove away at first, he threw the knife at her tire and again missed. Michael didn't go into the parking lot to retrieve the knife. Michael didn't really want to talk about the incident just that he used the female to sexual intercourse and she was, "Bipolar." Michael knew her for years and they lived together in Louisiana and came to Colorado to work together. Michael felt obligated to help her as long as she helped him. I asked him why he didn't leave when he had the first issue with her and he laughed and said that she kept having intercourse with him, which made him happy. However Michael was upset that the female was on her period and he couldn't have intercourse with her and was upset that she got blood on his sheets. I kept friendly conversation with Michael who talked about his military service and other worldly issues. Corporal Cordova asked Michael if he wanted to write a written statement as to what happened. Michael said, "F*** that." Michael said that it was a waste of our time and money being there for the incident.

Michael was hard to understand due to slurring words, however he was able to understand questions when I asked them. Michael was cooperative up until the time when Officer Antorino served him with a summons. Michael began to yell at both Corporal Cordova and Officer Antorino and called me, "Babe" and was friendly and even flirty towards me by winking and pointing. I told Michael to listen to them and to stop yelling. Michael didn't like that and became even more argumentative and loud. Officer Antorino served Michael with the summons and explained it to him. Officer Antorino had to place the summons inside the door because Michael wouldn't take it. Michael then took it from inside his room and threw the paper outside. Corporal Cordova explained firmly to Michael that he could also be cited for littering if he didn't stop.

Michael tried to go inside and slammed the door so hard that it wouldn't latch. Michael then went back outside and began yelling at officers and the female who was trying to leave (she was also served with a summons). I stood by my fully marked patrol car and yelled toward Michael to just go inside and shut the door, or I would go to the lobby of the hotel to let them know he was causing a disturbance and they could trespass him from the property as well. Michael became upset again and then slammed the door to where it latched. Officer Antorino and Corporal Cordova had to stand with the female to ensure she

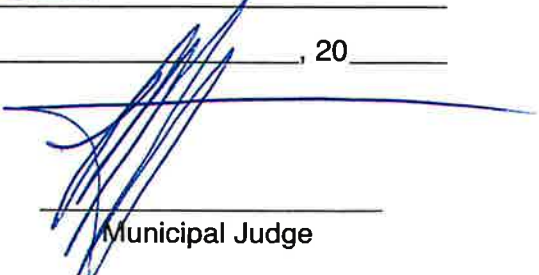
